Spay/Neuter Information

The night before surgery, your pet should not have any food or water after 10:00 p.m and none on the morning of surgery either.

You will take your pet to Hoof & Paw Animal Hospital on Hwy 6 between 7:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m. on the morning of the surgery. Hoof and Paw will call you when you can pick your pet up after surgery.

Your new adopted pet will be undergoing anesthesia for the procedure of spay/neuter. With all surgeries there are always inherent risks associated with the anesthesia and surgery. We and our veterinarians always use all reasonable measures to insure the health of the pet, but there may be occasion when a pet may have an adverse reaction during the spay/neuter process.

The Brazoria County Humane Society **accepts financial responsibility only for the spay/neuter surgery itself and rabies if the animal is over 3 months of age at the time of surgery.** The Brazoria County Humane Society **vaccinates only with the vaccines that are appropriate for the animal (age) at the time of adoption.** We do vaccinate with a **DHLPP** vaccine and depending on how long we may have the animal, we may also vaccinate with a Bordetella vaccine. We de-worm all animals when they first arrive in our program and try to keep them on a rotational de-worming schedule every two weeks until adopted. If they are due for a de-worming treatment at the time of adoption we will send de-wormer home with the new adoptive family. All dogs are tested for Heartworms over the age of six months. Any dog under six months of age is automatically negative for heartworms and does not need to be tested, just placed on heartworm preventative. All cats are tested for FelLK over the age of 3 months. **If the kitten is under 3 months it is not tested.**

Below are some extras that you may want to have done when you take your pet into our veterinarian for surgery. These extras are things that the Brazoria County Humane Society does not pay for and you as the new pet owner are responsible for paying. These items are not mandatory.

1. Pre-surgical blood screen. Recommended for animals over age 5 years.
2. Pain medication following the procedure. (Injection)
3. Oral pain medication to go home with the pet.
4. Oral antibiotics.

Estimated cost for items.

Packed Cell Volume (checks for anemia)	\$17.06
Spot Chem 6 (checks liver & kidney functions)	\$49.85
Torbugesic Injection (for post surgical pain)	\$25.50
Deramaxx (Oral medication for mild pain to go home) (based on weight)	\$20.25 - \$26.50

Tramadol (Oral medication for moderate pain to go home) (based on weight) \$18.00 - \$20.00
 Torb elixir (Oral medication for moderate pain to go home) (based on weight) \$29.25
 Oral Antibiotics (to prevent infection) (based on weight) \$26.51 - \$40.00
 E Collar (to prevent chewing surgical site) (depends on size) \$12.49 - \$26.49

Miscellaneous items that you may want to purchase (ask for prices) **Bordetella Vaccine, Heartworm Preventative, Booster Vaccinations, Flea Preventative, etc.**
